MANIFESTO GUIDELINES

A GUIDE FOR CREATING YOUR MANIFESTO FOR CG & MAC CANDIDATES OF THE 2024 ISSU AN CHOMHDHÁIL BHLIAINTÚIL ELECTIONS.





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What is a Manifesto?

- Any person running for a position on the CG or MAC must produce a manifesto.
- A manifesto is a public declaration of policy and aims. The electorate will understand your beliefs, stances and ambitions should you be elected into office.
- Your manifesto promises something to the electorate, therefore you should not describe projects or guarantee the realization of a particular vision if you won't be able to follow through.
- Manifestos should be clear, concise and to the point.
- Your manifesto not exceed 500 words.
 - A translated version of this manifesto may also be produced, limited to 1000 words.



What should be in a Manifesto?

Your manifesto should include:

- Opening statement about yourself (no more than 2 lines)
- Projects / Campaigns / Events you will undertake.
- Changes / Improvement / Reform you will make for students and to the union.
- Aims / Ambitions / Goals / Visions
- Relevant details about your past experience that makes you suitable for the role

Your manifesto should **not** include:

- Vague statements
- False achievements / experience
- Too many words. Keep your point short & concise

Be as creative as you wish in creating your manifestos, however you must submit the manifesto along with ensuring you have your nomination from your student council before 11:50pm on March 23rd.

It is advised that you consult the ISSU Constitution and use the officer brief to aid your manifestos.



TIPS & TRICKS

- We recommend using the free online graphic designer, for your manifesto. The website is easy to use and navigate. If you are experienced using any other design software you may use that if you wish.
- Make sure your manifesto is in Poster or A4 format, and downloaded it as a PNG/JPEG to ensure the best quality.
- Use a photo of yourself, it makes your manifesto more personal.
- Use a campaign slogan, you'll stand out and be remembered.
- Stay honest, don't make promises you know you can't keep, stay true to your beliefs.

Student Empowerment

Every elected officer should receive training in the following areas: advocacy and dealing with decisionmakers, leadership, teamwork, policy writing, interacting with media. However, we need to extend this training to our membership.

Effective Engagement:

We need to effectively engage with our grassroots, our ROB, our ISSU School Reps and most importantly our membership.

The Presidential Vote:

A president should work to unite the NSE they lead. Therefore, I believe that a president should only vote in the event of being a tie-breaker vote and should remain neutral in all other votes.

Following the launch of our Report on the Senior Cycle and Senior Cycle reform, the union needs to be focused on working with the Department and relevant stakeholders to ensure that reform is at the top of the educational agenda.

Transition to a Post-Covid Era: As we emerge from an incredibly stressful and uncertain time for students, the ISSU needs to be strong and organised with clear goals and aspirations in mind.

Gaeilge, Culture and Language: As the representative body of English-medium and Irish-medium schools, we need to continue our transition to a bilingual union.

Image-Based Sexual Assault:

We need to protect survivors of IBSA. Let's link with organisations such as CEARTAS, Text 50808 and End IBSA Ireland to create a helpline specifically for second-level students.
